## STORMWATER MANAGER - FAYETTEVILLE, NC

Fayetteville, NC (pop. 210,000) The City of Fayetteville is an award-winning city that is home to Fort Bragg, the Army's headquarters for Airborne and Special Operations forces, and Pope Army Air Field. The city is constantly growing, changing and supporting more than 210,000 residents, making it the sixth largest City in North Carolina. With a median age of 30.7, Fayetteville is filled with the energy of young adults and families with young children.

Located in Cumberland County, the City is more than 250 years old and steeped in history. The City's 150 square miles include a historic downtown shopping area, numerous historic sites, seven museums, three colleges and universities, multiple entertainment venues, and award-winning golf courses. Fayetteville is conveniently located within two hours of Myrtle Beach and other east coast beaches, as well as within close proximity to camping, fishing and hiking.

Whether walking the Cape Fear River Trail, visiting Fascinate-U Children's Museum, or attending one of the annual festivals or events, the city offers year-round entertainment for everyone. Conveniently located within a couple hours' drive of Myrtle Beach and other popular east coast beaches, families can make day trips to the ocean or they can head north to the scenic Blue Ridge Mountains for a weekend of camping, fishing or hiking.

Downtown is also home to a newly constructed baseball stadium that houses a Minor League affiliate of the Houston Astros. The stadium is adjacent to a recently redeveloped historic hotel property offering residential and mixed-use units, spurring numerous other retail and dining attractions to the area. Significant attractions like the Airborne Special Operations Museum, Festival Park, outdoor activities, sports complexes and the North Carolina State Veteran's Park make Fayetteville a destination for travelers.

Growth in Fayetteville is expected to continue with the construction of the I-295 loop around the city. While not all of the area is within the city limits, it is expected to spur development at the interchanges as well as provide an avenue for the development of additional commercial and residential growth within the city.

### THE POSITION:

The Stormwater Manager position is part of the Public Services Department and will manage, supervise, and coordinate the services and activities of the City's Stormwater Program and will coordinate assigned activities with other city departments, divisions, outside agencies, public officials, regulatory officials, and the general public. The position will provide highly responsible and complex administrative support to the City Engineer.

The Manager will participate in the development of, implement, and manage the goals, objectives, policies, and priorities for Stormwater services including design, maintenance and repair of the drainage system, monitoring and assessment of the overall storm water quality, implementation of all required permit elements established by the Environmental Protection Agency, and execution and compliance with all necessary contractual agreements for the delivery of services by other city departments or external third parties.

They will determine and recommend appropriate services and staffing levels. Additionally, they will evaluate program management operations and activities to include the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery methods and procedures; work load, administrative and support systems; and internal reporting relationships. Identify, recommend, and implement improvements and modifications.





The successful candidate will have the following qualifications and experiences:

- An ability to provide stormwater management direction for the City's long-range capital plan for stormwater management through their Engineering Division and the ability to manage and guide those projects from beginning to end.
- An advanced knowledge of principles and practices of hydrology, hydraulics, stormwater management systems and a thorough knowledge of governmental regulations, particularly as it relates to the Environmental Protection Agency stormwater regulations, the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), and the Clean Water Act as well as applicable sections of the City's Code of Regulations or other agency regulations that apply to the City's facilities and permits required for stormwater project management.
- An ability to cultivate a strong working relationship with residents, employees, businesses and stakeholders by providing leadership on stormwater regulations.
- Equivalent to a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in engineering, environmental sciences, public administration, or a related field. A bachelor's degree in civil engineering or related field from an accredited college or university; a registered North Carolina Professional Engineer (PE) license or eligible to have the license transferred within six months of employment.



- Five years of increasingly responsible experience in Stormwater management or related work including two years of administrative and supervisory responsibility, to include a program that has a Stormwater utility fee.
- Additionally, a Certified Construction Manager, Certified Floodplain Manager certification, Certified Stormwater Manager, Project Management Professional, or Municipal Administration course completion is preferred.
