Looking to move to a wonderful Midwest City with a lot to offer? Welcome to Fort Atkinson! Fort Atkinson has a population of 12,489 with an average age of 41.6 where you can be part of a community that is ideal for families, students, professionals and more. Fort Atkinson offers residents a dense, small City feel with a downtown and many amenities within walking distance of residential areas. Fort Atkinson focuses on the quality of life for residents and features first rate services and ample opportunities for recreation and entertainment.

The City is a vibrant community located along the Rock River, a few miles upstream from Lake Koshkonong, in Jefferson County. It prides itself as being the largest city in Jefferson County and was developed at the former site of Fort Koshkonong which was used during the 1832 Black Hawk War. Fort Atkinson's name is derived from the original fort and General Henry Atkinson, who oversaw the U.S. Forces during the war. Fort Atkinson is known best as the home of the Fireside Dinner Theatre, which presents professional Broadway musicals year-round along with fine dining, boutique shops and other attractions. You can explore the city's rich heritage by visiting the many cultural sites including the historic downtown, the Panther Intaglio, the Dwight Foster Public Library, the Hoard Historical Museum and National Dairy Shrine, and more. With the scenic Rock and Bark Rivers meandering through town, residents and visitors alike can enjoy the water by boat, canoe, or along the riverwalk which connects to the Glacial River Bike/Pedestrian Trail for easy adventuring. From activities and attractions, to fairs and festivals, the city provides a warm, inviting atmosphere to enjoy.

Fort Atkinson features a Council-Manager form of government with five council members who are elected at large in a non-partisan setting and an appointed City Manager, who runs the day-to-day operations. The City provides a complete municipal service profile like many stand-alone communities in southcentral Wisconsin. Fort Atkinson covers an area of 5.8 square miles. The City is seeking professional leaders as qualified applicants for the position of Fire/EMS Chief who also serves as the City's Emergency Management Coordinator.

FORT ATKINSON LIVING

Located in the south-central part of Wisconsin, at the confluence of the Rock River and the Bark River, Fort Atkinson gets its name from founder General Henry Atkinson, who built Fort Koshkonong in 1832. Although the city is small, the rich heritage and scenic views along Rock River make Fort Atkinson a popular place for visitors. The town city also offers a number of year-round recreational activities like boating, fishing, and more. If you are traveling with kids, don't miss the Family Aquatic Center, which features water slides, play areas for children, and more. Rock River Park, Bark River Park, and the City's paved bike trail are a few more amenities that improve the quality of life for residents. Check out some of the things to do in Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin, that you can indulge in while visiting.

Explore Historical Hoard Museum

This museum has several exhibits from the 19th century and the Lincoln Era. Here you can learn more about General Henry Atkinson, take a peek into the lives of the people who lived here, and President Abraham Lincoln's role in the Black Hawk War. This museum also houses a Bird Room, which is full of taxidermized birds, including that of the extinct passenger pigeon. You can take a guided tour of the five gardens on-site as well.

Visit the Dwight Foster Public Library

The Dwight Foster Public Library's mission is to help people achieve their full potential by being a leading resource for information, education, culture and recreation. The Library features an exceptional Library of Things, and an archive of internationally-acclaimed poet Lorine Niedecker's work, personal library collection, and artifacts. Thousands of people visit the Library annually to check out items, participate in programming, and use the community rooms. It is truly a community gem.

FORT ATKINSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

- The Fire/EMS Department is made up of 16 full-time staff (Chief, three Division Chiefs, twelve new line personnel) and twenty-nine paid-on-call firefighters and EMTs.
- In addition to serving the City, the department provides fire and EMS services to portions of the following five townships: Koshkonong, Jefferson, Oakland, Sumner, and Hebron.
- In 2021, the city completed construction of the fire station addition and renovation. The project reached completion slightly over the projected budget of \$5.5 million. The facility has room for growth in staffing and services and will serve the community for many years into the future.
- As a paid-on-call Department, it experienced a significant increase in call volume and exceeded five hundred emergency responses in 2021 for the first time in department history. Additionally, in 2021 and 2022 the Department experienced more than twenty-five structure fires resulting in three fire-related deaths and more than \$4 million dollars in property loss.
- In 2023, the Department transitioned to a combination full-time and paid-on-call department, assumed the responsibility for full EMS 911 response, which will also impact the demand for services.
- The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Fund is used to track all revenues and expenditures associated with
 the provision of 911 emergency medical services, including 50% of the twelve full time Firefighter/Paramedics
 and Firefighter/EMT-As hired in late 2022. Revenues in the fund include billing for the ambulance service
 provided by the Fire Department, contract revenue from the Towns of Koshkonong, Jefferson, Oakland,
 Sumner, and Hebron, EMS funding from the state, and miscellaneous donations.
- The department portion of the 2022 2026 capital reserve budget includes apparatus, computers, turn-out ensembles, small equipment and tools, mobile and portable radios, and extrication equipment.
- The Fire Department budget is \$2,072,350 for the current fiscal year.

- Ability to work within the City's organizational structure as a member of the Management Team, representing both the interests of the Department and of the City as a complete organization.






CREDENTIALS:

- Bachelor's degree preferred in fire science, public administration, or closely related field.
- Five years of progressively responsible public safety experience with at least five years management experience at the Lieutenant level or above, or any combination of education and experience which provides equivalent knowledge, skills, and abilities.

- A valid Wisconsin motor vehicle operator's license.
- CPR certification required.
