HISTORY AND BACKGROUND

Fort Worth, Texas was established in 1849 as an Army outpost on a bluff overlooking the Trinity River. It is in North Central Texas and covers nearly 359 square miles in Tarrant, Denton, Parker, and Wise counties - serving as the seat for Tarrant County. As Fort Worth continues to grow and change, these principles help keep employees on point, providing the best service to residents, businesses, and fellow employees.

Fort Worth is the 13th largest city in the United States by population. Of all cities over 50,000 people, Fort Worth had the largest gain in population in the past year, adding 19,170 people (approximately 53 people per day). Of the top 30 most populous cities, Fort Worth is the fastest growing, at 4.1% population growth since 2020. Of the top 30 most populous cities, Fort Worth ranks 24th in terms of population density (only Oklahoma City, Jacksonville, Nashville-Davidson County, Memphis, Indianapolis, and El Paso are less dense than Fort Worth).

Fort Worth is under a City Manager form of government with a ten single member City Council district and Mayor elected at-large. The City has an eleven-person appointed Park & Recreation Advisory Board. The Park & Recreation Director serves as the liaison to the Park Board and City Manager. The Assistant Director-Golf and Athletics Division is appointed by and reports directly to the Park and Recreation Deputy Director and is responsible for the implementation of policy and overall operations of this Division.

PARK & RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The Park & Recreation Department's (PARD) mission is to enrich the lives of our citizens through the stewardship of our natural and developed resources and the responsive provision of quality services and recreational opportunities. Throughout the history of the development of the Fort Worth park system, the Department has effectively anticipated and responded to the park, recreation, and open space needs of the community. The City of Fort Worth Park system comprises 300 parks, totaling over 13,063 acres of parkland.

Through the acquisition and development of new park land and facilities along with the maintenance of existing infrastructure, the Department strives to manage natural and developed resources effectively and efficiently. A focus on conservation and preservation is found in departmental programs and facilities such as the community tree planting program, the Nature Center and Refuge, the Log Cabin Village, and the Zoo and Botanic Garden through partnerships. The Park & Recreation Department provides services, programs and opportunities that enhance the well-being of the community. Unique facilities such as skate parks, mountain bike trails, and dog parks reach a diverse population. Programs pertaining to fitness, adult and youth athletics, nature, arts, culture, and education are offered throughout the Department.

The Department continues to develop and implement strategies, policies, programs, and partnerships that effectively leverage resources resulting in positive economic impact for the City of Fort Worth. Overall, the Park and Recreation Department serves all people, including special and vulnerable populations, by creating spaces and places for all to enjoy.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF PARK & RECREATION (PARK OPERATIONS DIVISION)

The City of Fort Worth is seeking an innovative leader and high energy professional to fill the Assistant Director position in the Park & Recreation Department's Park Operations Division. This position reports to the Park & Recreation Director, supervising a park operations staff of 122 full-time employees through five direct reports. The division has a total annual operating budget of \$20 million for the 2024 budget year. The Park Operations Division actively maintains 263 parks (6,252 acres) and public spaces citywide within an overall park system of 300 parks (13,068 acres).

The ideal candidate will effectively lead the activities of the Park Operations Division including but not limited to the following:

- Plan, coordinate, administer and evaluate current projects; ensure compliance with federal, state, and local laws, regulations, codes and/or standards as well as City, Department and Division policy and procedures.
- Supervise staff (five direct reports) including the prioritization and assignment of work, conduct performance evaluations and make personnel decisions or recommendations.
- Assist with development and implementation of departmental goals, objectives, and policies as well as development and oversight of external and internal communication activities.
- Review park operations policies and procedures as well as maintenance programs and practices; review of all park operations resources and user fees as part of the annual budget process; oversee the development of the annual budget recommending the annual budget for the Park Operations Division.
- The candidate must have the ability to analyze and assess parks operational needs and make appropriate adjustments if required; prepare strategic business and annual work plans to implement and consistently meet enhanced service delivery standards; the candidate must demonstrate the capacity to set effective and equitable priorities to serve the needs of a demographically diverse community.
- The candidate must have strong people skills including the experience and capacity to maintain positive employee morale and the ability to collaborate and build strong relationships with community organizations, neighborhood groups and other City departments.
- The successful candidate must have a proven ability to be an excellent communicator, effective listener, quick learner and creative and innovative problem solver & finance, procurement, human resources, the use of information technology, and other principles of public administration.

OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

- The PARD is undergoing an Aspirational Study to determine how: "By the year 2030, the Fort Worth Park and Recreation Department will be recognized as one of the top 10 park and recreation departments in the nation."
- The resultant Aspirational Plan will provide a blueprint of annual phased improvements in each of the next five fiscal years FY2025 2029. The Assistant Director of Park Operations will be expected to:
- Develop and implement enhanced operation and maintenance standards; and identify, document, achieve and communicate performance metrics related to elevated service levels.
- Lead the development and implementation of service plans including the effective and timely allocation of operational resources. The candidate must have the ability to effectively delegate the development and implementation of management service plans to meet new expectations and standards.
- Plan for, grow with and assume the management and operations of additional parks and open spaces of an increasingly growing park and open space system including the effective development of staff and service plans, the identification of technical equipment/technology needed to maintain additional park inventory in a consistent manner to high standards meeting or exceeding service level expectations.
- Capacity to plan for the operations and maintenance of future capital improvements and new properties developed and acquired through bond funded capital improvement programs, grants, contributions, park dedication fees and the annual cash capital reinvestment program.
- Pursue and implement new natural resource practices, programs, and green infrastructure opportunities that will benefit the citizens and differentiate the City of Fort Worth from other communities.

EDUCATION

Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major course work in recreational science, physical education, horticulture, public or business administration, social services, or a related field, and six years of increasingly responsible experience in park maintenance operations, including three years of administrative and supervisory responsibility.

Possession of a Valid Driver's License at the time of hire. If licensed from another state, the candidate must have the ability to obtain a valid Texas Driver's License within 90 days of employment.

PREFERENCES

- Experience with the management and operations of multiple public parks, open space, and amenities.
- Master's in public administration is a plus.
