## **ABOUT MIAMI BEACH**

Nestled along Florida's southeast coast, Miami Beach is a cosmopolitan, tropical, island city with a vibrant and diverse community. Spanning seven square miles, the city offers miles of pristine beaches and a continuous Beachwalk that stretches from end to end. Miami Beach is home to a world-class convention center, with more than 21,000 hotel rooms, a thriving arts and cultural scene and an eclectic mix of dining, shopping and nightlife.

With its turquoise waters and iconic Art Deco charm, Miami Beach has evolved from a quiet retirement haven into a dynamic, international resort and convention destination. Its rich history dates back to the early 20th century and continues to shape its vibrant present. The city features 45 parks, offering everything from waterfront greenspaces and playgrounds to parks, pools, fitness zones and even an ice-skating rink. Every resident lives within a 10-minute walk of a park, reinforcing the city's commitment to accessible outdoor spaces and quality of life.

Today, Miami Beach has a residential population of approximately 80,000, but its average daily population swells to nearly 200,000, reflecting its global appeal. Miami Beach is a youthful, multi-cultural, modern community with an average age of 40 and a growing base of working professionals, families and higher-income residents.









## THE ORGANIZATION

The City of Miami Beach operates under a Commission–City Manager form of government, delivering a full range of municipal services to both residents and visitors. The City Commission — comprised of a Mayor and six Commissioners — sets policy direction, while the City Manager oversees day-to-day operations and administration. ## ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION

The Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation for the City of Miami Beach serves as a key member of the department's executive leadership team, helping to guide one of the most comprehensive and innovative parks and recreation systems in South Florida. The City of Miami Beach Parks and Recreation Department manages 45 parks, two 18-hole municipal golf courses, numerous recreation centers, playgrounds, athletic fields and aquatic facilities that serve residents and visitors year-round. The department is dedicated to promoting healthy lifestyles, environmental stewardship, and community connections through a diverse range of programs, cultural events, youth sports, senior activities and fitness opportunities.

Reporting directly to the Director of Parks and Recreation, the Assistant Director provides strategic and operational leadership across multiple divisions, including park and landscape maintenance, park rangers, facilities maintenance, golf operations, capital improvement projects and a myriad of special projects. This position oversees a large, geographically dispersed staff and ensures that all facilities and services meet the City's high standards of safety, sustainability and excellence. The Assistant Director collaborates closely with city officials, community organizations and residents to deliver responsive and inclusive parks and recreation opportunities, enhance the city's natural and built environments and support Miami Beach's vision of being a world-class destination for recreation, culture, and community life.

#### **Ideal Candidate**

The ideal candidate will be an experienced and forward-thinking parks and recreation professional with a proven record of success in managing complex operations, capital projects and maintenance programs in a municipal or comparable public sector environment. They will bring a balanced background that combines technical expertise in parks and facility management with strong leadership, communication and organizational skills. A strategic problem solver with a hands-on approach, the ideal candidate will be comfortable overseeing diverse functions—from construction and landscape maintenance to recreation operations, park safety and community engagement.

The successful candidate will be a collaborative leader who inspires trust, fosters teamwork and builds positive relationships across departments, community organizations and with the public. They will demonstrate exceptional judgment, political acumen, and the ability to thrive in a dynamic, high-visibility environment. The Assistant Director will value innovation, efficiency, and service excellence, leading with integrity and accountability. A background in coastal or urban park systems, experience managing multimillion-dollar capital projects and a commitment to sustainability and resiliency will be key assets.

## **OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES**

The Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation for the City of Miami Beach will have the opportunity to make a lasting impact on one of the nation's most iconic coastal communities. This dynamic leadership role offers the chance to guide a vibrant park system that seamlessly blends beaches, urban green spaces and cultural facilities serving residents and millions of visitors each year. The Assistant Director will play a key role in advancing major park redevelopment and capital improvement projects, strengthening maintenance operations and supporting the City's ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability and resiliency. This position also provides the opportunity to modernize operational practices, leverage technology to enhance efficiency and build community pride through beautifully maintained, inclusive and accessible parks and recreation facilities.

At the same time, the role presents meaningful challenges that require a strategic, hands-on and collaborative leader. The Assistant Director must balance complex capital initiatives with daily operational demands while maintaining the exceptionally high standards expected in a world-class destination. Miami Beach's coastal setting adds the responsibility of designing and maintaining resilient infrastructure to withstand rising sea levels, salt exposure and storm events. Success will depend on the ability to coordinate effectively across departments, communicate clearly with stakeholders and take a proactive approach to workforce development and resource management. The ideal candidate will thrive in this fast-paced, high-visibility environment by combining technical expertise, creative problem-solving and a deep commitment to public service.

## **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation oversees a complex and diverse portfolio that includes capital projects, park ranger operations, facilities and landscape maintenance, golf operations, administrative services and other special initiatives. Working through subordinate managers and supervisors, the Assistant Director ensures the effective management, operation and programming of the City's parks, community centers and recreational facilities.

Key responsibilities include developing and implementing divisional objectives, establishing service standards and evaluating progress toward departmental goals. The position oversees the preparation and administration of the division's budget, including forecasting revenues and expenditures, ensuring proper fiscal control and maintaining high-quality service delivery. The Assistant Director assists the Director in promoting the use of recreation facilities and programs to meet community needs—ensuring accessibility, inclusion and engagement across all demographics.

This position also provides leadership in the maintenance, beautification and safety of all parks citywide. Responsibilities include planning and supervising landscape and forestry operations, diagnosing plant and tree conditions, coordinating nursery stock and maintenance standards and overseeing construction and maintenance crews in the field. The Assistant Director ensures efficient scheduling of personnel and equipment, supports City events and maintains strong coordination with other departments and contractors.
